GBC adds two new certificate programs

Graduates with a business degree can now choose from two new certificate programs at Goldey-Beacom College. The Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Accounting is designed for students who have already completed a degree in another field of business study. The curriculum includes the courses specific to the B.S. in Accounting and also the course work that satisfies the requirements for the Delaware C.P.A. examination.

Students may also enroll in the Accounting 150-Hour Certificate Program. Current accounting majors, working accountants, or accounting graduates from any college should explore this program if they someday hope to be a CPA. Students whose college credit hours are less than 150 hours may not be eligible for the CPA exam or licensure in most states. William P. Brady, Esquire '91, Melvina M. Brown, Ed.D. '84 and Jerry King '98, '00 represent the best of Goldey-Beacom College. They are individuals who have achieved career success while contributing to the improvement of their communities.

The tradition of recognizing and honoring prominent alumni continued this year with the induction of Dr. Melvina M. Brown and Jerry King into the College's Distinguished Alumni Gallery with William P. Brady receiving the 2007 Rising Star Award.

In 1984, Dr. Brown graduated from Goldey-Beacom College with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Accounting and a Minor in Computer Science. She continued her education, graduating *magna cum laude* with an MBA and *summa cum laude* with a Doctorate of Education both from Wilmington College.

Dr. Brown's financial career began as an investment accountant with Provident National Corporation in 1984 and has grown through experience with the E.F. Hutton Trust Company, Reichold Chemical Corporation, Primerica Bank, and Meridian Bancorp. From 1993 to 2006, Brown rose to Vice President of MBNA America Bank. Today, at Bank of America, her area of expertise is supplier management, and she is responsible for the oversight of the technical contract labor commodity.

In her spare time, Dr. Brown enjoys community service. She is an Honorary Board Member of Aids Delaware and has served as a Board Member for the Bayard House and the Rainbow Chorale of Delaware.

Jerry King serves as President and CEO of Dexsta Federal Credit Union. Mr. King holds two degrees from Goldey-Beacom College. In 1998, he received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Accounting and in 2000, Mr. King received his Master of Business Administration with a Concentration in Human Resources Management.

Mr. King began his career as a Junior Accountant for the Philadelphia Stock Exchange in 1987. He later joined Sun East Federal Credit Union in Aston, Pennsylvania, as Head Bookkeeper.

In 1989, he joined Dexsta Federal Credit Union in Wilmington, Delaware, as Vice President of Finance. Today, as President and CEO of Dexsta Federal Credit Union, he is charged with leading the organization through the preparation and execution of strategic and business plans.

Basketball teams' efforts earn them most successful season



The GBC men's and women's basketball teams produced one of the most successful seasons in the history of both programs. The men's team capped off the 2006-07 season with the program's first ever ECAC Championship, by defeating Molloy College, 86-70.

Under fourth year **Head Coach Chuck Hammond**, the team finished with a 15-13 overall record an 11-9 conference mark, and qualified for the CACC Tournament for the second time. The team also received the CACC Sportsmanship Award.



The 2006-07 campaign proved to be the most victorious season in the seven year history of the women's program. With second year **Head Coach Jennifer Smith** at the helm, the Lightning set a program record for most overall and conference wins in a season, finishing with an 18-11

overall and 14-8 conference mark. The Lightning was the third most improved team in all of Division II from last season to this season. Once again ,they qualified for the conference playoffs, this time advancing further then ever before to the semi-final round.

Golf team qualifies for NCAA Division II Regional

The Lightning qualified for the NCAA Division II Northeast Regional golf tournament, where they finished in fifth place. They fired a team total of 970 for the tournament. GBC finished in 2nd place at the 2007 CACC Golf Championships with a one-day score of 312, one stroke behind first place Post University. Senior **Steven Cutler** finished second overall and just one stroke behind the winner.

Softball team struggles through season with injuries

The Goldey-Beacom College softball team faced many injuries throughout the 2007 season, which directly reflected upon their record. The team earned wins over Simmons College, Columbia Union College, and Nyack College. **Kendra Russell** led the team with a .380 batting average and also tallied 38 hits, 20 RBI's, and 5 homeruns on the season. **Sarah Gehman** was second on the team with a .349 batting average and contributed 37 hits.
