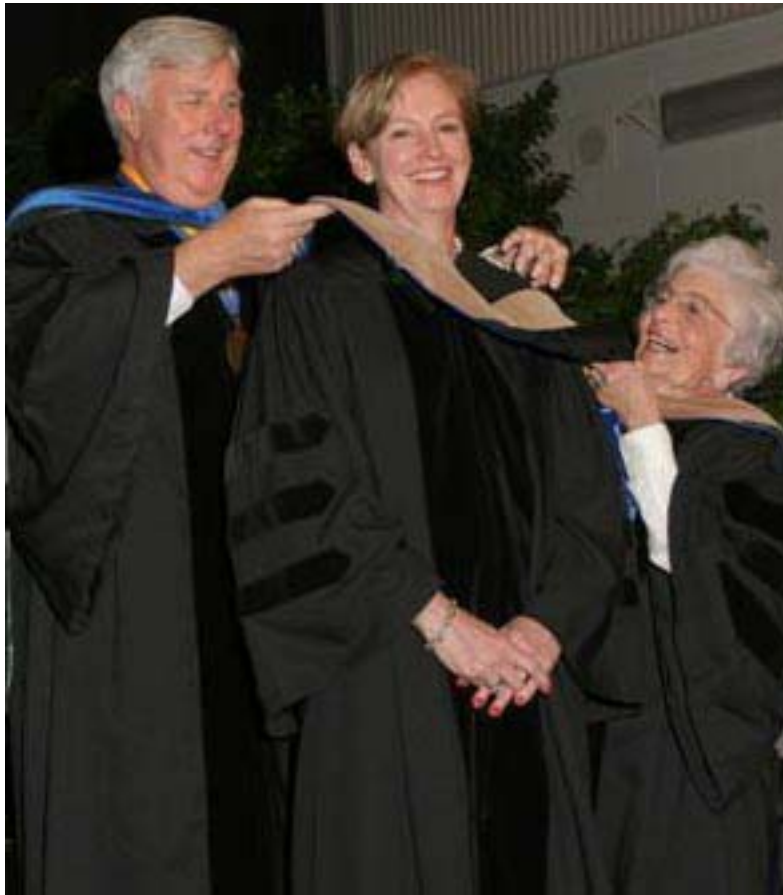

Kullman guides graduates with six rules for success

Ellen J. Kullman was the College's guest speaker at this year's commencement ceremony. Ms. Kullman is Executive Vice President at the DuPont Company and a member of the Office of the Chief Executive. This year, she was assigned the overall leadership to drive DuPont's aggressive growth in international markets.

Over the years, she has achieved many milestones that include being the first woman at DuPont to be appointed Executive Vice President and being named to *Fortune Magazine's* "50 Most Powerful Women in Business List" in 2005, 2006, and 2007.

Deeply involved in her community, she has served on the boards of General Motors Corporation, Tufts University, The National Safety Council, Christiana Care, and the Blood Bank of Delaware.

During her speech, she shared six rules that she found to be beneficial guidelines to a fulfilling career. Those are:

1. Focus on who you **can** be – discipline and desire are a powerful

combination

2. Seek feedback from those you respect – not always those who agree with you

3. Communicate by listening – avoid distractions

4. Be open to opportunity – take the chance to do something different

5. Embrace positive energy in yourself and others – avoid 'energy vampires'

6. Stay true to your values – goals and plans need to be rooted in your value system

Also during the ceremony, faculty member Dr. Kirk D. Johnson was honored with the Excellence in Teaching Award.

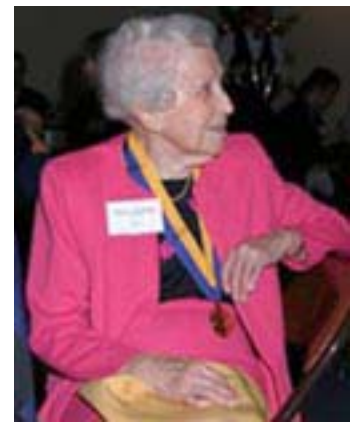

Alumni Spotlight: Lankford leads in real estate industry

Gene Lankford didn't plan on becoming a real estate mogul back in 1955 when he graduated from Goldey-Beacom College; even his extensive resume doesn't indicate that career choice. Nevertheless, the description suits him well.

Lankford's real estate prowess spans over the Southern Delaware region covering Rehoboth Beach, Dewey Beach, Bethany Beach, Milton, Dagsboro, Georgetown, Fenwick Island, Lewes Beach, Millsboro, Seaford, Laurel and Milford. His real estate holdings include the Atlantic Sands Hotel, Breakers Hotel, and Village by the Sea. Gene is co-owner/founder and chairman of the board of the Ocean Atlantic Agency, one of the area's premier real estate companies. He is

also co-owner of Ocean Atlantic Associates, a real estate community developing company.

Gene began his career with the DuPont Company, working there for six years before resigning to go into the real estate business. He adds, "The 'perfect storm' of 1962 put me out of business, and I went to work for the State of Delaware." During that time, he also earned his degree from the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania.

After one year with the State, he joined General Foods Corp. During the next 13 years, Lankford served in various positions within the company's labor relations and personnel departments, eventually becoming Director of Personnel for all GF subsidiaries.

Lankford continues, "It was in this capacity that General Foods loaned me to Delaware's Governor Tribbitt on a government leave of absence to become the state's Director of Personnel overseeing all state employees as a part of the governor's cabinet. Two years later the loan expired. During that time, I had been dabbling in real estate and elected not to return to corporate life. It was the beginning to a very successful career."

GBC played an important role in preparing Gene for the world of real estate. He adds, "In addition to my education, my time at Goldey-Beacom was as much about friends and classmates who I met as well as alumni contacts that provided much of my start in business."
