Certificate program to qualify Accountants for CPA exam

GBC tailors new program to meet 150-hour CPA requirement

Goldey-Beacom College has unveiled a new certificate program to help accountants and accounting students meet newly implemented requirements to take the CPA Examination.

The American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) and the National Association of State Boards of Accountancy (NASBA) jointly created the Uniform Accountancy Act in 1984, recommending that all states require 150 total college credit hours in order to sit for the CPA exam. Forty-nine of the fifty states have already implemented or plan to implement some version of the new requirement to take the exam or to obtain licensure. Delaware has not yet done so.

Goldey-Beacom's Accounting 150-

Hour Certificate Program will be tailored for each student to assure he or she has completed the requisite number of credits. Though it includes recommended core courses in Business Ethics, International Business Management, and additional accounting courses, students may also select courses outside the business area.

Dr. Julie Burkey, Associate Professor of Accounting at the College, stressed, "Completing this certificate provides the hours needed to sit for the exam in any state, but it also allows a student to more easily transfer a CPA Certificate from a state that does not have the 150-hour rule to a state that does." AICPA has stated that after 2006, they will no longer recognize for full membership new individuals who have

not met the 150-hour requirement.

In announcing the new program, College spokesman, Dr. Gary L. Wirt, pointed out that, "The College has crafted this program with the part-time evening learner in mind, assuring flexibility and convenient scheduling. Students can easily work through this program while employed full-time." Wirt also pointed out that most college graduates with a bachelor's accounting degree have already typically completed 120 to 138 of the 150 needed credit hours.

Courses begin in January and will be offered year round. Students may apply and enter throughout the year by contacting Larry Eby, Assistant Director of Evening Studies at 302-225-6289 or ebylw@gbc.edu.

They defeated Wilmington College in their first-round game and then lost to eventual champion Philadelphia University. The team was led by junior Ashley Carberry who was named to the All-CACC second team and junior Kendra Russell who was named to the CACC All-Tournament Team.

Men's Soccer

The Goldey-Beacom College men's soccer team finished the season with an overall record of 4-10-1. They earned wins over Kutztown University, Nyack College, Bloomfield College, and Columbia Union College.

Cross Country

McKaskill recognized for personal, educational and career achievements

Suzanne McKaskill '04 received the Achievement Award at the Fresh Start Scholarship Foundation's 10th Anniversary luncheon this past October.

The award is presented to a Fresh Start Scholar who has demonstrated significant achievement by overcoming personal obstacles in her life, facing financial challenges, excelling academically during her collegiate career, building a career as a professional, and serving as a role model for future scholars.

Suzanne overcame personal and financial challenges to achieve her goals. She explains, "I left California and moved to Delaware to change my life. I had a two year old son, Zane, and I was faced with the challenge of having to raise him alone. I made a promise to myself that I would do anything I needed to ensure that he had a good childhood and a happy life. I enrolled in college, was a full-time student, and I worked two part-time

jobs and tried to be a 'super mom' to my super kid."

That determination and drive led her to earn an Associates Degree in CIS at Delaware Tech, a Bachelor of Science in CIS from Goldey-Beacom and a Master's Degree from Wilmington College. She credits the Fresh Start Foundation for providing the needed financial assistance that enabled her to go as far as she did in higher education.
